## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

available to keep them competitive in this ever-changing world in which we live. This annual report will tell you about these successes and more. You'll read about our Honors Program achievements, student successes, and faculty accomplishments.

The good news is only tempered by the challenges that we continue to navigate due to the uncertain State budget climate. Millions and millions of dollars in State funding have been cut from community colleges and the California State and University of California systems since the economy plunged beginning in 2008.

While Riverside County's unemployment numbers soared during 2010-11, thousands of people turned to MSJC for job training and to continue their education. Among them were those who wanted to prepare to re-enter the workforce, others fresh out of high school looking to register at a community college and students who were originally bound for the CSUs or UCs but found that those systems not only raised tuition fees but also reduced the number of students they would accept in a given year. Add those numbers to the area's ever-increasing population and that drastically increased the number of students depending on MSJC to meet their individual job training and educational needs.

At the same time, our college budget took a hit when the State cut \$2.8 million on top of the \$650,000 they cut from our funding the previous year. In 2011-12, we anticipate (at press time) a \$4.7 million reduction in State funds. The funding cutbacks have been a blow felt by community colleges and the entire public education system up and down the state.

Still, we've kept on serving our constituents, enrolling more than 1,000 students over and above the amount of funding MSJC receives from the State. We have been able to serve these additional students by utilizing department efficiency measures and following the responsible fiscal leadership of the MSJC's Board of Trustees, the executive administrative team and the Shared Governance Budget Committee. The District focused on protecting funding for instruction, became leaner and more efficient by cutting overtime and travel, implementing a hiring frost and even dipping into our reserves to make sure we served as many students as possible so they could realize their educational and job training goals.

We have definitely been challenged to think out of the box and embrace what everyone seems to refer to as the "new normal." Having said that, we certainly have learned a lot from weathering this fiscal environment. Listening to the experts' future forecast, it looks like the community colleges can expect a few more years of the same economic turmoil as we continue to grow. MSJC is prepared for those challenges. We will continue to follow the sound fiscal leadership from our Board of Trustees. We will face the future utilizing data and planning to guide the mission of the institution and will always keep the education of our students our first priority.

### NEW PASS CAMPUS

Mt. San Jacinto College opened its San Geronio Pass Campus with counseling and enrollment services on Nov. 2, 2010. Classes began in January 2011.

The new campus is located at 3144 West Westward Avenue, Banning 92220.

Classes offered at the San Geronio Pass Campus include general education courses needed to transfer to four-year institutions, administration of justice, and child development.

While Mt. San Jacinto College continues to offer evening courses at Beaumont High School, the new campus allows the college to offer daytime and evening classes and boost local class offerings.

The San Geronio Pass Campus is built on two of 50 acres it owns. It has four classrooms, counseling, enrollment offices and restrooms in modular buildings.



### EAGLE ATHLETIC CLUB HALL OF FAME CELEBRATION 2010



Thanks to a generous \$25,000 donation from the Soboba Band of Luiseno Indians, Mt. San Jacinto College was able to open the Eagle Athletic Club Hall of Fame in 2010. Legendary coaches John Chambers and Robert Stangel and Alvin Walton, MSJC football standout in 1982 and 1983, were the first to be inducted in the Hall of Fame. Walton went on to play six seasons with the Redskins, including in Superbowl XXII.



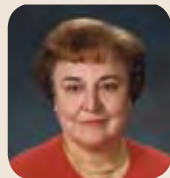
### NEW POLICE CHIEF

## Looking Ahead

Construction of a new Social Sciences and Humanities classroom building on the Menifee Valley Campus began in Spring 2011. The new addition is expected to open its doors to students by Fall 2012.

The state is providing 100 percent funding for the building. The state funds are earmarked so the funding can only be used for construction and furnishings.



This new building will allow MSJC to move some classes that are currently held in aging portables into the new facility with state-of-the-art equipment.

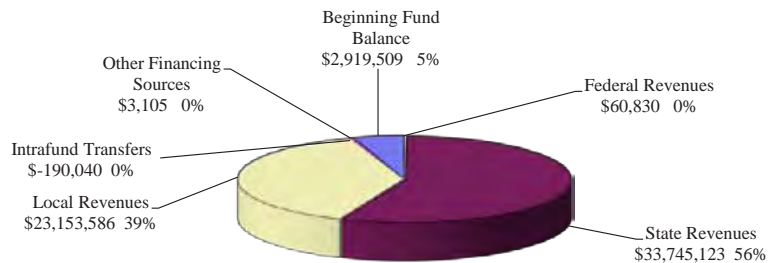


Construction: Classrooms at Menifee Valley Campus

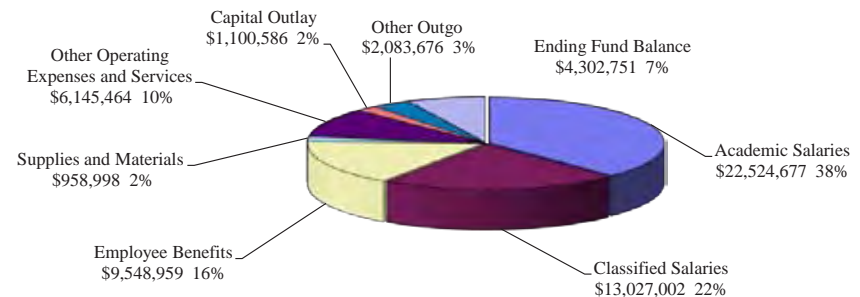
The new 2-story building will house classrooms, laboratories, offices, and meeting rooms and other facilities to benefit students. This building will be approximately 33,885 gross square feet.

## MSJC Achievements

### LARGEST GRANT IN MSJC HISTORY

Mt. San Jacinto College students have access to more programs designed to help them succeed and stay in college and improve graduation and transfer rates thanks to a \$2.8 million federal grant.

The 5-year grant from the U.S. Department of Education—Developing Hispanic Institutions Grant Program is the largest grant in the college's 47-year history. The grant is designed to help Hispanic Serving Institutions, or those with a 25 percent or larger Hispanic student population and will support the entire MSJC student population. This grant comes at a key time when the State budget crisis is resulting in funding cuts to community colleges.

### CAL BAPTIST UNIVERSITY OFFERS DEGREE PROGRAMS AT MSJC

Students can earn Bachelor's Degrees from Cal Baptist University by attending programs at Mt. San Jacinto College's Menifee Valley Campus under an agreement between the two institutions.

The partnership between MSJC and CBU, formalized in October 2010, will provide greater access and convenience to students seeking to complete their degrees at about half the cost of private, traditional/residential tuition.



### STUDENT HIGHLIGHTS

**Pricila Chavez Lara** is a 2009 MSJC graduate who transferred to UC Riverside. She will graduate in June 2012 with a bachelor's degree in music. She has been busy in 2010-11, making MSJC proud to call her an alumnus.

Chavez Lara received the Presser Foundation Undergraduate Scholar Award for 2010-11. She decided to use the \$4,800 award, which is given for music and music education, to establish the Hemet Youth Orchestra to bring music to youngsters in the area. She was approved to start a strings instrument program through the Hemet Unified School District through an after school program.

Her other achievements include: a California Assembly and Senate award for community service; internship with Riverside County Philharmonic and acceptance to the Bard Music Conservatory in New York for a summer 2011 program.

In her busy schedule, she still manages to find time to serve as a Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics program mentor at MSJC.

### FACULTY HIGHLIGHTS

**Dr. Phill Morrione**, Chair of Music, Audio Video Technology, retired after nearly three decades at MSJC. Dr. Morrione started at MSJC in 1982 as a music instructor. During his tenure at MSJC, Dr. Morrione was instrumental in opening a state-of-the-art music and audio technology building at the San Jacinto Campus and creating an innovative Audio Technology program that has received national and international recognition. One of his last achievements was developing and launching EagleVision, the MSJC television station that provides hands-on experience for students in broadcasting.



**Dr. Roy Mason**, chairman of the Department of Natural Sciences at the Menifee Valley Campus, and two of his students took off in June 2011 for Denmark to study alternative energy. The National Science Foundation-funded research trip included research at two Danish universities. MSJC students Nicholas Van Deusen, of Murrieta, and Palita Thamparipatra, of Temecula, will assist Mason in writing teaching modules about the technology they learned so it can be shared with other students in the United States.

### STUDENTS GET NEW BUS SHELTERS; MSJC RANKS #1

The Mt. San Jacinto Student Government Association once again contributed toward a bus shelter for students. In late 2010, the SGA contributed \$4,000 toward the \$20,858- project after hearing a presentation from SGA Senator Kenneth Prado.

The SGA, formerly called the Associated Student Body, also contributed \$3,000 toward bus shelters on the Menifee Valley Campus three years ago.

MSJC ranked #1 the state in the Hands Across California fundraiser. Generous donors gave more than \$5,000 that will be used for student scholarships. ### FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

The MSJC Foundation continued to live up to its mission of promoting student success when it awarded more than 70 students scholarships that totaled \$110,000 in 2010-11.

**Rebekah Tolopilo** of Temecula was one of those students. She was one of only 60 selected nationwide to receive the prestigious Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship. The \$30,000-a-year award will help her receive a bachelor's degree to become a physician's assistant.

She said she is grateful for the scholarship. "There are four of us kids. We've never been in want, but we just don't have a whole lot of money to put toward a college education," Rebekah said.

**Dakota Downs**, a two-time, First-Team All Conference men's basketball player for MSJC, signed a scholarship in 2011 to continue his education and athletic career at Concordia University. Downs also pitched two seasons for the MSJC Eagles baseball team and will play both at Concordia. Downs is a graduate of West Valley High School in Hemet.

**Karen Scott** of Hemet received a total of \$3,282 in 2011 through the MSJC Foundation, including \$1,000 each from the Rosemarie Ramos Memorial and Henry O. Cassle scholarship funds. The scholarships mean she can turn in her waitressing apron and focus on her studies at MSJC to become an RN.

"I think it's going to change my life dramatically," Scott said of the scholarships and ability to continue her education. "Not only being able to help other people, but also it's going to help my husband, daughter and I. We'll be more secure and have health insurance. We won't have to struggle as much."

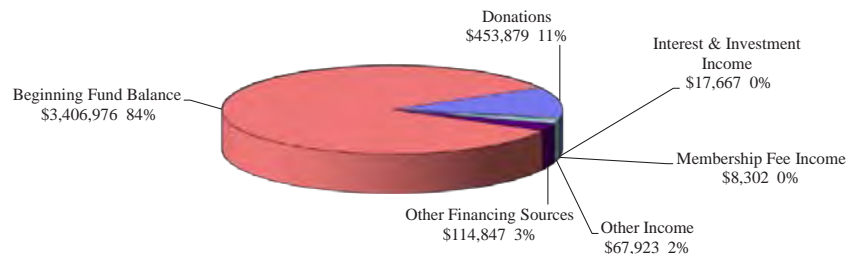

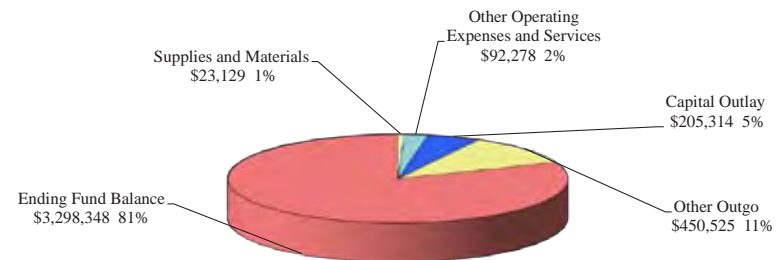
