

Objective 051 Teacher Instructions

This objective is based on a single online task that has 4 steps. Each step has a series of “Notes” sheets which will be used for the student to record results and information required for the exam.

Keep in mind there are three main content areas of this task: Personality Quiz, Job Research, and Education Research.

Each step is described below. A PowerPoint is provided in the following link that takes the students through each step of the task.

Step 1: Take the O*Net Interest Profiler and Complete Reflection

1. Use O*NET Online to acquaint students with the system for career based assessments and job search capabilities of the website.
2. Follow the link: <https://www.mynextmove.org/explore/ip>
3. Follow the directions on the Profiler. There are also step by step directions in the PowerPoint. I suggest that you use this to navigate the quiz with your students at the same time that they are taking it themselves.
4. Give students at least one hour to complete the 60 question quiz. A hard copy is available if necessary.
5. Have students fill out the “Notes” sheet.
 - a. Students will need to write down their personality, job zone and educational results.
6. Have students complete the reflection on the personal interests in 1-5 paragraphs (number of required paragraphs is based on the student’s level).
 - a. **“Notes” should be used during the Task!**

Step 2: Research a Job

1. Students will continue from Step 1 to complete the job information worksheet.
2. They must choose a job (from their results) and supply the following information by filling in the worksheet provided in the “Notes” and Task.

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- a. Name, type, location, pay, educational requirements, experience required, and reason of choice for a SINGLE job from their results in the O*Net portal.

Step 3: Comparison Chart

1. Students must research two schools from the results of the O*Net Interests Profiler and make a comparison chart. This will be based on the SAME job from Step 2.
2. Students must compare 6 points of interest for each school and describe how these are “barriers” to their attendance to the chosen programs.

Step 4: Select a Work Sample and Reflect on Learning

1. Students must select one of the above activities to submit for the Task. They may choose the “Notes” sheet from Step 1, 2 or 3. They must then explain why they chose this sample in as little as 1 sentence.
2. Students must answer the 3 yes/no questions that reflect on their learning of the entire task.

Reflection Example:

_____ During the O*Net personality quiz, I learned many things about my personality and the different jobs that would be best for me. My highest scoring personality was the “Realistic” personality. This means that I would do great in a job that is hands-on. For example, I could work with animals, machinery or a job that is outside.

For the Job Zone part of the quiz, I chose Zone Two because I have not really had previous experience with working in a “hands-on” job. After choosing this Zone, the results showed lots of jobs. The one I found the

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most interesting was a Pet Groomer. The job I found the most surprising was a Non-venomous Reptile Handler.

Although these jobs sound fun, I do not think they are the right fit for me. I don't think I would do well with dogs because I have allergies and snakes scare me. I think that it would be better to go back and look at other "hands-on" jobs that do not involve animals.

This resource has helped me learn more about career opportunities by giving me jobs that are based on my interests and giving me information on those jobs. The website profiler was very thorough and gave me good information to help me decide that these were not the best jobs for me.
