WHEN TO USE THE CSUGE PATTERN

CSUGE can be used towards all Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADTs) and other transfer degrees at MSJC. These degrees require a minimum of 60 semester CSU transferable units with a minimum overall GPA of 2.0 and a minimum of 18 units within a specific [transfer degree major](#). Please confirm minimum California State University (CSU) requirements for specific majors and programs. Students can refer to [ASSIST](#) for CSU major preparation and confirm minimum CSU requirements for specific majors and programs.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE

AREAS A1, A2, A3, B4 (CSU Golden Four) require a C grade or better from a CCC. **NOTE:** If a student completed a Golden Four course at a CSU where a C- grade is acceptable to certify a Golden Four area, MSJC **will** honor the C- grade if taken at a CSU, per [CSU EO 1100](#). Title 5 stipulates that CCCs can use plus and minus grading, except that the C- may not be awarded by a CCC but will be accepted if taken at a CSU.

APPLICATION FOR CSUGE CERTIFICATION

CSUGE Certification is completed by the CCC that the student is transferring from. Full certification of lower division CSUGE is met by completion of all general education areas. Students can apply for CSUGE Certification through [Enrollment Services](#). A minimum of 39 semester units in AREAS A-F are required for full certification of lower-division general education requirements.

CSUGE for STEM is (partial certification) only allowed for an approved STEM Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) Degree. Students must confirm the CSU major, program, or college that they are applying to accept **partial CSUGE certification**. Although CSUGE for STEM is an option, students should prioritize completing major-preparation courses for the specific campuses and programs they are considering.

CSUGE Breadth for STEM (33 units): Only permitted for an approved Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT Degree). The CSUGE Breadth for STEM can only be applied to the **Biology, Chemistry and Environmental Science ADT Degrees**. The CSUGE for STEM requires:

- **AREA A:** 9 semester units/12 quarter units; one course from A1, one course from A2, and one course from A3
- **AREA B:** 9 semester units/12 quarter units; one course from B1, one course from B2, and one course from B3 (if not met in B1/B2), and one course from B4
- **AREA C:** 6 semester units/9 quarter units; one course from C1 and one course from C2
- **AREA D:** 3 semester units/ 4 quarter units by selecting one course
- **AREA E:** 3 semester units/ 4 quarter units by selecting one course
- **AREA F:** 3 semester units/ 4 quarter units by selecting one course

DOUBLE-COUNTING

Some CSUs will allow [HIST-111](#) U.S. History to 1877, [HIST-111H](#) Honors U.S. History to 1877, [HIST-112](#) U.S. History Since 1865, [HIST-112H](#) Honors U.S. History Since 1865 or [PS-101](#) Introduction to American Government and Politics, [PS-101H](#) Honors Introduction to American Government and Politics, [PS-120](#) California Government or [PS-120H](#) Honors California Government to double count in AREA D and the U.S. History, Constitution and American Ideals area. Students should consult the receiving CSU transfer institution about double counting. MSJC allows double counting of these courses for AREA D and US-1.

NOTE: Double counting within other areas of CSUGE is not allowed. Although a course may be listed in more than one subject area, a single course may be used just once.

AP Scores

AP scores of 3, 4, or 5 can be used to satisfy any CSUGE subject area where acceptable. Please refer to the [MSJC AP Chart](#) to confirm how exams can be applied.

IB Scores

A score of 5, 6 or 7 on Higher Level exams is required to grant credit for CSUGE Breadth certification. An acceptable IB score for CSUGE equates to either 3 semester or 4 quarter units for certification purposes. Students who have earned credit from an IB exam should not take a comparable college course, as transfer credit cannot be granted for both. Please see an MSJC Counselor for approved courses.

Military Service

CSU Executive Order 1036 encourages campuses to use evidence of military training to satisfy AREA E for their students who enroll without a prior General Education certification. Veteran students are able to provide proof of completion of basic training as listed on discharge papers, Form DD-214. All CSU campuses have elected to honor CSUGE transfer certifications that clear AREA E with Form DD-214.

Every effort is made to keep this information current. Transfer and articulation are ongoing processes and courses are subject to changes on this option. Please use this information as a guideline and consult with a university representative or a MSJC Counselor for questions. Student are encouraged to visit [ASSIST](#) for the current CSU and UC major preparation requirements for transfer and approved general education courses for MSJC. Students are encouraged to meet with a Counselor to develop a comprehensive educational plan.
