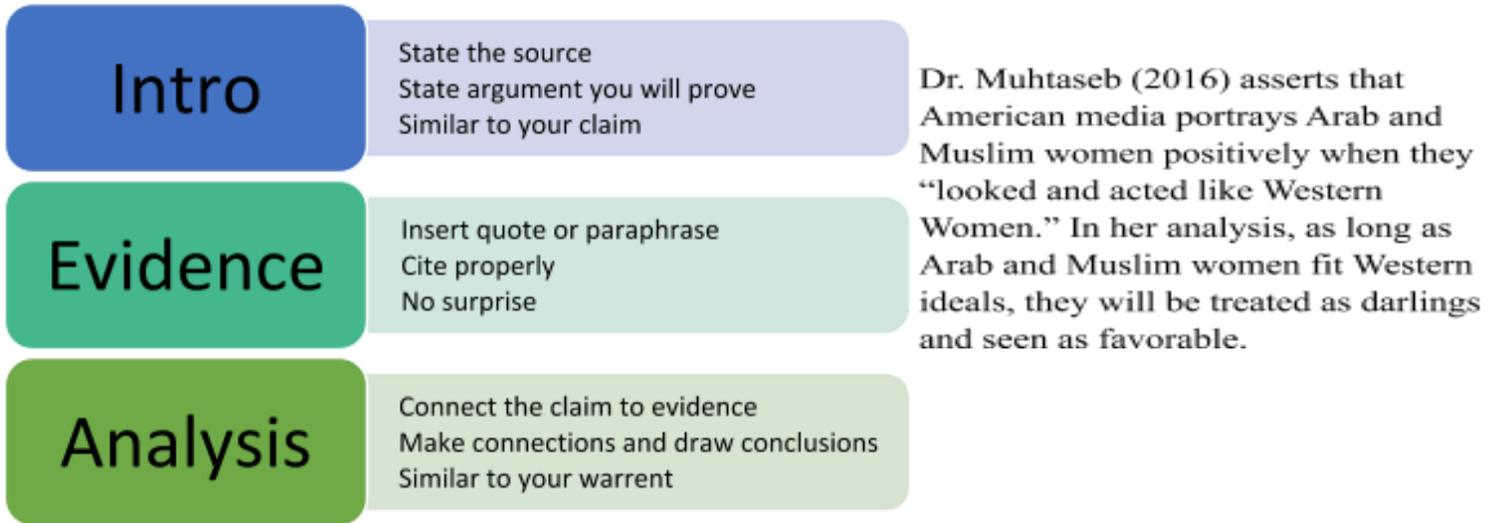
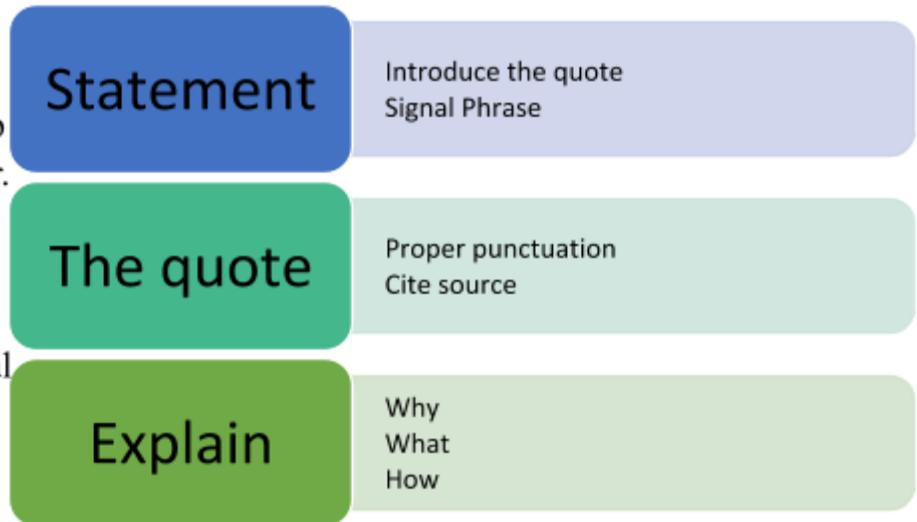


Inserting a Quote: The Basic Quote Sandwich



In an effort to understand the relationship between waste disposal on tribal land, Dr. Clarke (2010) explains that “the relationship is multi-influential and interactive.” In essence, it is impossible to ignore that the tribe influences disposal while the disposal also influences the tribe



While community college is the only option for many students, critics argue that those who enter community college will not be as successful as those who enter a university.
