COVID-19 Vaccines, TB Tests and You

Many MSJC employees who will receive the COVID-19 vaccine will also require routine employment-related TB testing or other vaccines. The full impact of the COVID-19 vaccine on TB test accuracy and effectiveness of other vaccines is currently unknown.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that if you have recently received the COVID-19 vaccine, to please allow at least four (4) weeks from the date of second vaccination to obtain the intradermal tuberculin test (TB Skin Test) or TB blood test. However, these tests may be performed at any time before the first COVID-19 vaccine is administered.

Please note: No other vaccines should be administered for two weeks before or after either dose of the mRNA COVID-19 vaccine series.

If you have recently received notification of your TB Test requirements at MSJC and are scheduled to receive your COVID-19 vaccine (or have been vaccinated), please contact me via email at ljames@msjc.edu. We may provide you with an authorization form for the TB Test and notate your file of your pending vaccination status. We are happy to answer any of your questions.

As COVID-19 vaccines become more readily available, hope is on the horizon. There are many questions as to where, when and how to obtain the vaccine. Education personnel are among the first to receive the vaccine because of the essential role in serving students. Getting vaccinated now will help protect you, students, coworkers, and the community we serve when we begin phasing back to campus.

To be eligible for paid time off, you will need to notify your supervisor in advance of your scheduled appointment. You will also be required to submit dated documentation and proof of vaccination to Human Resources.
